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The Board

APQN Board Online Meeting Held in April

APQN Board convened online on April 8, 2025, under the leadership of President Dr. Galina Motova. The meeting brought together all Board directors to discuss strategic priorities aimed at strengthening the organization's sustainability and stability.



One major topic was the APQN Board re-election. After reviewing survey results and proposals, the Board reached a consensus on the need for a term extension to ensure stability, with the final decision to be made by the vote of the General Council at the upcoming 2025 Annual General Meeting (AGM). Related to this consensus, Prof. Dr. Jianxin Zhang was appointed to lead the amendment process of APQN Constitution.

The Board also finalized the keynote speakers for the 2025 APQN Academic Conference (AAC) -- Dr. Hattori Yasunao (Japan), Mr. Lucas B. Kavlie (USA) and Dr. Vicki Stott (United Kingdom). Invitations and communication will follow after the meeting.

Furthermore, a new website tender was approved, with a preference for a Shanghai-based service provider to ensure close coordination with the Secretariat. The website is expected to serve as a transparent, multi-functional platform with enhanced features such as voting and review tools.

Updates were shared on reimbursement procedures. The Secretariat is working



closely with individual Board directors to revise relevant documentation and aims to settle all outstanding reimbursements within the year.

In terms of membership policy reforms, the Board discussed the need to improve the efficiency and transparency of membership applications, voting, and annual analyses. Efforts to identify accessible digital collaboration tools are necessary. The Board emphasized the need for enhanced website functionalities, including voting and review features.

Finally, the Board highlighted the importance of increasing visibility for APQN's recognition mechanisms, APQR and APQL, including proposals for dedicated funding and potential legal registration of APQR.

The meeting concluded with appreciation for the Board's dedication and commitment to advancing the agreed initiatives.



APQN Releases 2024 AAC Anthology

The Asia-Pacific Quality Network (APQN), in partnership with the Certification



Association Russian Register, is proud to announce the release of an Anthology drawn from the landmark 2024 APQN Conference: Navigating the Future of Global Tertiary Education. Hosted jointly by APQN and the Russian Register in Saint-Petersburg, Russia from 26 to 29 September 2024, this prestigious gathering brought together quality assurance experts, institutional leaders, and policymakers from across the Asia-Pacific region and beyond.

The Anthology brings together the conference's key discussions about quality assurance in higher education. It focuses on current problems and new solutions in the field. It comes at an important time, as universities worldwide

face two major challenges: adopting digital technologies and expanding international cooperation. It provides practical, research-supported approaches to help teachers, accreditation organizations, and education officials manage these complex changes.

Selected by an editorial committee chaired by Dr. Aleksandra Zvezdova (Russian Register) and Prof. Jianxin Zhang (APQN), the anthology's contents represent the most impactful contributions from the conference's plenary sessions, expert panels, and research presentations. The volume stands as both a record of current best practices and a forward-looking guide for QA professionals preparing their institutions for the challenges of tomorrow's higher education ecosystem.

The first section, QA for Cross-Border Higher Education: International Standards, Challenges, and Solutions, explores the complexities of transnational education through multiple lenses. Dr. Liu Yunsheng's research on reshaping educational quality assurance systems provides a macro-level perspective, while Dr. Aleksandra



Zvezdova's work on the APQN Quality Label offers practical frameworks for international accreditation. Case studies are complemented by Dalkhat Ediev's analysis of demographic trends impacting global higher education.

In the second section, Embracing Digitalization for QA: Innovations and Future Trends, contributors examine technology's transformative role. Hongxu Liu with co-authors present groundbreaking research on AI-enhanced smart classroom evaluations, while N R Mohan and K R Vishnu Mahesh chart new pathways for QA in the digital age.

The third section, QA in Higher Education Institutions: Fostering Excellence in Teaching and Learning in All Stages of Life, gathers diverse institutional perspectives. Dr. Ruchi Tripathi's NAAC-accredited case studies reveal effective teaching quality frameworks, while Dr. Samanth Wickramasinghe and Dr Sunesh Hettiarachchi analyze internal QA's impact on faculty performance in Sri Lankan institutions. Additional contributions, such as Huang Rong and Liu Lei's research on senior university development and Nayer Fardow and his co-authors' work on lifelong learning QA models, create a comprehensive picture of excellence across educational stages. including Anatoly Lysyakov's examination of the joint research college of two Universities in Russia and China, demonstrate successful models of cross-border collaboration



Concluding with Enhancing Internal Quality Assurance of QAAs: Innovations and Governance, the anthology features Dr. Jianxin Zhang and co-authors' qualitative research from APQN's 20th anniversary celebrations alongside practical governance studies. Ariunbold Jaaljav and Basbayar Batmunkh outline Mongolia's national qualification framework

alignment and Dr. Yudha Nurhantari's audit findings from Indonesia.

Together, these thematically organized contributions – ranging from macro-level policy analyses to institutional case studies – provide both theoretical frameworks and actionable insights for navigating quality assurance in an era of globalization and digital transformation. The anthology not only reflects on current challenges but also charts a course for future innovation in global higher education quality standards.

DAQAR is an open database of higher education institutions and study programmes accredited by quality assurance agencies registered in the Asia-Pacific Quality Register (APQR). Nowadays there are more than 5700 external review reports of 291 HEIs in the Database.

As a full member of APQN we extend a warm welcome to your agency to join APQR and gain all benefits of this membership: 1) the exclusive right to upload the results of accreditation procedures in DAQAR on a free-of-charge basis; 2) being registered in APQR confirms that your agency is reliable, authentic and entrusted; 3) your agency becomes visible on the international arena, thus, boosting the opportunities for international cooperation with other agencies and HEIs; 4) APQR increases competitive advantages of your agency on the national and international levels; 5) APQR registration increases confidence in the results of your quality assurance activities. It ensures that students, employers, and institutions can trust the quality of education provided by the programmes you accredit; 6) promotion of agency's activities internationally.

The eligibility criteria for APQR registration and the application process are described here: https://apqr.co/eligibility-criteria/criteria-process.

Given the fact that your agency is a full member of APQN and has considerable background in quality assurance of higher education, the site-visit for your agency in terms of APQR review can be held online (no travel and cost of stay expenses).

Please also note that if your agency has already undergone the external review by another reputable QA network (INQAAHE, EQAR, etc.), the acceptance to APQR can be carried out based on the outcomes of such review. For more details please contact apqnsecretariat@163.com

Call for Expressions of Interest (EoI) to Host 2026 AAC and AGM

Dear APQN members,

Warmest greetings from the APQN Seventh Board and the Secretariat!

The APQN Board is seeking Expressions of Interest (EoI) from member organizations to co-host the 2026 APQN Annual Conference (AAC) and Annual General Meeting (AGM). We welcome EoI to host the conferences from all members (it is not the practice to hold the consecutive event in the same country).

AAC and AGM are major events of the year and good opportunities for members to update themselves on the latest trends in quality assurance and liaise with their colleagues in the region. They focus on improving quality assurance in education, academic and practical exchanges and communications, not involving any political issues of any country. The goal is "Dissolving Boundaries for a Quality Region" and the mission is to "enhance the quality of higher education in Asia and the Pacific region".

The proposed dates of AAC might be from June to December 2026. The tentative program of AAC and AGM is as follows:

The responsibilities of the local host:

- Making the following drafts and submitting to the APQN Board:
 - 1) the overall theme and 4 sub-topics;
 - 2) the budget;
 - 3) the proposed registration fee (no more than 300 USD).
- Handling onsite registrations. The registration fees are used by the local host, but 50 USD per international participant will be submitted to APQN to meet its overheads and processing charges. APQN Board members (no more than 10) and invited keynote speakers (no more than 3) will be registration waivers; while for local participants, the host can have its own decision.
- Being responsible for the expenditure, including the registration kit (the programmes; the booklets of participants; conference materials, etc.), 3 buffets, 4 coffee breaks, a half-day excursion including a meal (the participants could be charged a small fee as a guarantee and help the organizers to book transportation and meals), travel of the keynote speakers, complimentary gifts and certificates for chairs, speakers and presenters.
- Arranging for all the venues (including the venues of the Board meetings and other committee meetings on the sidelines of the conference) and the conference facilities (including a paper printer for Secretariat, a computer and a slide show for PPTs in each session room, Wi-Fi for AAC, 3-5 good photos from each session, etc.) upon informing the APQN Secretariat at least 7 days before AAC.
- Arranging up-dating the registrants and handling the queries on travel, accommodation and visa, providing invitation letter for visa application and facilitating the visa procedure, if needed. Setting up a website of 2026 AAC with all the necessary information for participants, if possible.
- Conducting onsite or online evaluation survey of AAC and AGM and writing a 500-word report on the result; writing the 3000-word report of the AAC with 10-20 photos to be published in APQNews.
- Publishing APQN Proceeding of the selected papers with the financial support from APQN (if the host is willing to do), whose first responsibility and rights should be APQN.

Call for Nominations for 2025 APQN Quality Awards

Dear APQN members,

APQN Quality Awards were initiated in 2013 which aimed to mark decennial celebrations of APQN. By 2024, 73 awards have been given to prize winners both within and outside the Asia-Pacific Region. The Awards have given positive energy for APQN's long march of "Dissolving Boundaries for a Quality Region" as well as "to enhance the quality of higher education in Asia and the Pacific region through strengthening the work of quality assurance agencies and extending the cooperation between them".

APQN Quality Award is intended to identify and distinguish extraordinary or prominent QA contributions and good practices that have potential for replication in the Asia-Pacific area. APQN Criteria and Chiba principles will be generally applied to all categories as selection criteria. Based on "APQN Procedures Manual (version 3, 2017)", APQN would encourage members which have been doing much more outstanding work individually, institutionally, nationally as well as internationally to submit applications for Quality Awards.

The 2025 APQN Quality Award categories are as follows:

1. APQN Award of International Cooperation in QA (Two categories)

Category 1: This award is open to full and intermediate APQN members. This award recognizes organizations which have engaged in successful cooperation with other organizations internationally to further cross-border education and quality assurance of international initiatives.

Category 2: This award is also open to organizations outside the APQN region. This award recognizes organizations which have engaged in successful cooperation with organizations and institutions within the Asia-Pacific region to further cross-border education and quality assurance of international initiatives.

2. APQN's Best/Model Internal QA Award

This award category is for institutional and associate members only. The members who have committed to quality assurance mechanisms and quality culture building are encouraged to apply for this award so as to make much wider circulation about their best or model IQA practices and experiences.

3. APQN Climate Champions Award

This award recognises APQN members who have made exemplary contributions in terms of green and sustainable initiatives in response to climate change. Institutional efforts for research on global warming and climate action, on campus and beyond campus, through active collaboration of



faculty, students and society will be considered for this award. This award is for institutional and associate members category.

4. APQN's Best Model of QAA Award

This award is for quality assurance agencies (QAAs) only that are either full or intermediate members of APQN. The QAAs who have committed to EQA new-mechanisms, such as new standards, methods, measurements to match the IT and social development, are encouraged to apply for this award so as to make much-wider circulation about their best model EQA practices and experiences.
